Most learned Gentlemen,

The undersigned Carl von
Meijerfeldt (Son of Johan August von Meijerfeldt,
born and educated at Heilbrunn between the years
1760 - 1780. having served in the French and there,
after in the Dutch army, died at Rotterdam
June 2th 1835.) wishes informations concerning his
pedigree as he is quite unknown with it.

Some time ago a Dutch Newspaper of
June 24th 1862, passed my hands, with the following
Communication.

Helsingfors. On the 2nd of this June 1862 the
unsealing took place of the documents legated to the
University by the Field-marshal Eoval von
Meijerfeldt, in presence of the academical Senate.
Except a great many letters and other documents,
a.

a packet, was found, containing 388 letters and official documents, corresponded between the Fieldmarshal, King Gustave III and the Duke of Sudermanland. On the envelope the testator had written the following, "Extraordinary correspondence of the Earl von Meijerfeldt with King Gustave III and Duke Charles of Sudermanland, during the war of 1780-1790." These documents are expected to clear up the history of that time in which the possessor of these documents has played such an interesting part. - just now the Senate of the University (to which the Earl von Meijerfeldt before 50 years has bequeathed these documents) was allowed to unseal them according the articles of his last will. - Immediately after the opening a complete inventory of these documents has been made up, and as soon as possible they will be published."

As the Earl von Meijerfeldt, mentioned in this communication, undoubtedly is my Grandfather. I take the liberty to beg your College the necessary informations of these documents and of my ancestors, in the

fullest confidence of Your high appraised
& willingness.
